












At the start year, Defiance Public Library System launched a new service within hoopla called hoopla Flex, in an effort to reduce the amount of time you spend waiting for your favorite titles.

Introducing: CultureGrams Explore the world with your library card






Summer Lunches at Sherwood Branch

IMAGINE YOUR STORY!

SUMMER READING CONTINUES THROUGH JULY

Defiance Public Library System's (DPLS) annual Summer Reading Challenge for all ages is taking place now through July 31, with events, activities, reading contests, and free summer fun for all ages!

This year's theme, "Imagine Your Story," celebrates fairytales, folklore, fantasy and mythology, as well as the importance of sharing our own unique voices and stories. Summer library programs enhance lifelong learning, and provide meaningful, enjoyable experiences for the community. For school children, it can be a key tool in helping to prevent "the summer slide"—learning loss that may occur during the summer months.

For Kids

Both reading and activities count toward your Summer Reading goal. Beginning June 1, children can pick up an activity sheet at any library location (Defiance Public, Sherwood Branch, Johnson Memorial), print one at defiancelibrary.org, or log their progress online using Beanstack (defiancelibrary.beanstack.org) and the Beanstack Tracker app (earn coupons just for registering!) Kids can complete the activities on their own, or with the help of a caregiver.

Children from birth to age 3 will receive a toy link to accompany their activity sheet, while children ages 3-12 will take home a dog tag "Brag Bead" necklace, plus a few beads to get started. Once goals are met, return to the library to collect your earned rewards, including additional links or beads, and books. Patrons in Defiance and Sherwood also will earn an entry into a grand-prize drawing for tickets to King's Island.

For Teens & Adults

Teens and adults participating in the Challenge can log their reading minutes each day on Beanstack to win prizes too. Every 60 minutes read and logged earns the reader an entry into a weekly prize drawing for a \$5 gift card to a local coffee or ice cream shop. Those who log at least 480 minutes/8 hours of reading will be entered to win the grand prize of a \$40 gift card to Meijer and two \$5 gift cards to the winner's chosen coffee or ice cream shop.

Update: Worthington Project

Efforts continue to identify the bounds of and secure a historical marker for the suspected site of Worthington Cemetery: Defiance County's only historic Black cemetery. Recently, a GPR survey was conducted at the site, and detailed results of that survey are available to read in a guest article written by UPenn doctoral candidates Eric Hubbard and Chris LaMack, who conducted the survey. Visit the new Plant Library outside Defiance Public Library to leave plants you won't use, and take what you will!




